

Expert Witness Training – Cross Examination Foundations

About this Course

The provision of expert evidence under cross examination is a highly technical and specialised process, and is foreign to many expert witnesses.

Developed out of the ongoing difficulties faced by witnesses when providing evidence under cross examination, this course seeks to redress the imbalance which many expert witnesses face when giving testimony.

This course serves as a foundation on which specialists and professionals can understand more about the delivery of expert evidence under cross examination. It also serves existing and practising experts as a timely refresher in the fundamental aspects of the provision of evidence.

In this way expert witnesses (and their legal team) can be assured and confident that the expert will be well placed to effectively deliver evidence under cross examination.

Aim

The aim of this course is to provide a detailed information to expert witnesses on the delivery of evidence under cross examination in court and other judicial/quasi-judicial settings.

Witnesses

Instructors
