

Expert Witness Training – the Basics

About this Course

The provision of expert evidence is highly technical and specialised, and can be a very foreign experience for most witnesses.

Developed out of the ongoing difficulties faced by expert witnesses when providing (or looking to provide) expert evidence, this introductory course seeks to inform newly appointed and aspiring expert witnesses of this process.

This course serves as a foundation on which specialists and professionals with limited experience as an expert witness can understand more about the expert witness process. It also serves existing and practising experts as a timely refresher of their ongoing obligations as experts.

In this way expert witnesses (and their legal team) can be assured and confident that the expert will be well placed to engage in the expert witness process.

Aim

The aim of this course is to provide a general introduction to expert witnesses of their role and obligations as an expert witness.
