

Witness Skills Training – Police Officers

How police officers can deliver evidence confidently

Background

Giving evidence and cross examination can be a highly technical and specialist process which is alien to the vast majority of people and can cause them to feel nervous, stressed and extremely uncomfortable.

As part of their role, police officers and civilian support staff are regularly called on to provide evidence to courts, tribunals, inquiries, investigations and commissions, but they often find themselves unprepared for the process.

At these hearings, it is common that the witnesses' decision making, procedures, experiences, notes and considerations will be forensically analysed and debated. Witnesses will be required to justify their actions and can be criticised for these actions. This often causes considerable personal discomfort, as well as potentially reflecting poorly on their department or organisation.

Wouldn't it be helpful if there was a solution to prepare witnesses as to what to expect, how to deliver their evidence and to deal with the 'tactics' used by defence barristers and cross examiners in a court or tribunal?

Well, the good news is Loquitur has a solution. We have developed our Witness Skills training course out of the ongoing difficulties faced by police officers when providing evidence under cross examination. This course seeks to redress the imbalance which many police witnesses face when giving testimony.

Witnesses

Courses are suitable for **ALL police officers and civilian support staff** that may be required to be witnesses, although particularly useful for:

- Police support staff with limited court-room or cross examination experience but seeking to be confident in this.
- First responders with some cross examination experience but looking to “refresh” or hone their skills.
- Professionals in emergency response and policing looking to refresh or maintain any professional ongoing Continuing Professional Development (CPD) requirements.

Instructors
